Universal Social-Emotional Learning Screening K-12 Opt-Out Form

Marysville Exempted Village School District will continue to implement universal social-emotional learning screeners for all students K-12. The use of universal social-emotional learning screenings is a best-practice and helps us:

1. Provide data-informed and responsive supports to students in need;
2. Measure the overall effectiveness of our prevention and intervention services K-12, including effectiveness of curriculum; and
3. Guide professional development priorities for teachers, staff, and administrators.

Participation in the universal social-emotional learning screenings is voluntary. Your child does not have to take the survey. All information gathered from the screening is maintained in a strictly confidential manner.

Students in grades K-6 will complete a web-based screening instrument, called SELweb, which measures emotion recognition, social perspective-taking, social problem-solving, and self-control. Teachers, students, and optionally parents, in grades 7-12 will complete the Strengths & Difficulties Questionnaire (SDQ), which measure social-emotional wellness. In both instances (K-6 and 7-12), guidance counselors and school psychologist staff will follow up with students who demonstrate or are indicated to present with at-risk social-emotional skills.
